APA Bibliography Guide

Anthology

Editor Last name, First initial. Middle initial. (Ed.). (Year published). *Anthology title*. Publication Location, State: Publisher.

Example:

Burrell, A. & Cerf, B. (Eds.). (1936). *An Anthology of Famous American Stories*. New York, New York: The Modern Library.

Book with One Author

Author Last Name, First initial. Middle initial. (Year Published). *Title*. Publication Location: Publisher.

Example:

Allaby, Michael. (2003). *Dangerous Weather: Fog, Smog & Poisoned Rain*. New York, NY: Facts on File, Inc.

Book with Two Authors

First author last name, First initial. Middle initial., & Second author Last name, First Initial. Middle Initial. (Year Published). *Title*. Publication Location: Publisher.

Example: Kramer, A., & Williams, P. (2003). *A Century of American Films*. New York: Watts.

Book with Three or More Authors

First author last name, First initial. Middle initial., Second author last name, First initial., Middle initial., & Third author last name, First initial. Middle initial. (Year Published). *Title of Book*. Publication Location: Publisher.

Example:

Mauro, R., Papale, P., Lupi, L., & Stoppato, M. (2003). *Volcanoes*. Ontario, Canada: Firefly Books.

Book with an Editor

Editor Last name, First initial. Middle initial. (Ed.). (Publication year). *Title of book*. Publication location: Publisher.

Example:

Miller, J. (Ed.). (2003). *Thirteen Scary Stories*. San Francisco: Surfer's Press.

Chapter in a Book

Author last name, First initial. Middle initial. (Publication Year). Title of Chapter. In *Title of Book* (pp. Page Numbers). Publication Location: Publisher.

Example:

Decker, R. & Decker, B. (1979). Fire Under the Sea. In *Volcanoes* (pp. 29-47). New York: W.H. Freeman and Company.

Database Article

Author last name, First Initial. Middle initial. (Publication Date year, month day). Article title. *Periodical title, Volume* (issue), Page numbers. doi: doi number.

Example:

Khakh, B.S. & Burnstock, G. (December, 2009). The Double Life of ATP. *Scientific American*, 301(6), 84-92. doi: 123456789.

Interview

You do not include a reference in your bibliography. For interviews, you only need to do an in-text citation.

(Interviewee's First Initial Last Name, personal communication, Month Day, Year)

Example:

(A. Meyer, personal communication, September 23, 2010)

Online Encyclopedia Article

Title of article (Publication Date or n.d. for No Date). In *Title of Encyclopedia*. Retrieved from URL of Encyclopedia.

Example:

"Catacombs" (n.d.). In World Book Online. Retrieved from <http://worldbookonline.com>.

Article in Print Encyclopedia

Author last name, First initial. Middle initial. (Year of Publication). Article Title. In *Title of Encyclopedia*. (vol. volume number, pp. pages). Publication Location: Publisher.

Example:

Schrock, J.R. (1997). Copyright Infringement. In *Encyclopedia of Social Issues*. (Vol. 2. pp. 401-403). New York: Marshall Cavendish.

Print Magazine

Author Last name, First initial. Middle initial. (Year, Month Day). Title of Article. *Title of Periodical, volume* (issue), page numbers.

Example:

Perkins, S. (2010, August 28). Scour Power. *Science News*, 178(5), 14-17.

Website

Author Last name, First initial. Middle initial. (Publication Date). *Title of Page*. Retrieved from URL of Website.

Example:

Deen, J.M. (2010). *World Mummies*. Retrieved from <http://www.mummytombs.com/main.locator.htm>.
