

ADMISSION OF NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS

The Board of Education affirms that its primary responsibility is to provide the best possible educational opportunities for the children who are legal district residents and who are of legal age to attend school.

Non-Resident

The District will not accept non-resident students with the following exceptions:

1. future residents
2. former residents
3. student associated with student exchange program

Future Residents

The children of families who have signed a contract to buy or build a residence in the school district may be enrolled during the semester in which they expect to become residents, with tuition on a monthly basis.

Former Residents

Regularly enrolled children of families who have moved out of the school district may complete that marking period tuition free and would be eligible to pay tuition for a second quarter if that enabled the student to complete the semester. Children enrolled in 12th grade may attend with payment of tuition.

Student Exchange Program

When a non-resident student is associated with a well established and officially recognized student exchanged program such as American Field Service, International Fellowship, Inc., Rotary Exchange Students and Experiment in International Living (the host family shall be residents of the district. Prior written approval shall be obtained from the Superintendent.)

Transportation

Transportation will be provided for non-resident students if and only if existing bus routing is used, and there is sufficient room on the bus.

Tuition

Tuition rates shall be determined in accordance with the formula established by the Commissioner of Education.

Tuition for a non-resident student, whose parents own property within the district, but who do not reside in same, shall be decreased by the amount equal to the school taxes paid by the parents for such property.
