It is critical that our students are both participating in their classes digitally and turning in work through Google Meets, Google Classroom, and more as if they were in their regular classrooms. With regards to your child's grades, we are viewing them as a tool to continue to engage students and maintain our high standards of effort and progress with curriculum through what is a really distracting and difficult time. While the exact calculations for grades may vary from class to class, **please remind your child that their work is graded, and that work not turned in will be counted against their grade, just as it normally would.** Please be sure to check SchoolTool's Parent Portal in the upcoming weeks as grades begin to be posted (grades 6-8).

In order to stay caught up, it is imperative that your child checks their school email and each of their teachers' Google Classrooms daily. Parents can regularly check their child's grades and assignments that have been completed by either signing into Google Classroom as a 'guardian' or by using your child's account. If you have concerns, please reach out to those teachers.

Student Google Meet Expectations
