



**Ichabod Crane Central School District**

**Parent/Guardian Planning Survey for Reopening**

**Survey Results**

**July 2020**

In response to remote learning in Spring 2020 and the uncertainty of reopening schools in Fall 2020, Ichabod Crane Central School District has developed a task force to plan for three potential scenarios for school reopening. The Governor of New York has directed schools to create a comprehensive plan that addresses in-person instruction, remote instruction and a hybrid model that includes both in-person and remote instruction. The task force created a survey for parents/guardians of students within the Ichabod Crane School District to garner feedback on the recent implementation of remote learning and input to help inform future planning. The survey was conducted via Google Forms and was sent to parents/guardians via email. The survey was also made available on the ICC District website and via social media outlets.

Nine-hundred and thirty six surveys were submitted. Forty-five individuals were identified as submitting the survey two or more times. Duplicate entries that shared identical data from the same respondent were deleted so as to not falsely influence data results. Surveys that were submitted with zero responses were also deleted from the data set, resulting in data collection from 879 respondents. Respondents were afforded the opportunity to skip questions and in some cases to select multiple responses, therefore the number of responses per question is variable.



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


*Which school(s) will your child(ren) attend in the 2020-2021 school year? Select all that apply.*



*At this point in time, we are uncertain what school reopening in the fall will look like. As of now, which of the following possible plans best meets your family's needs?*




*What are your primary reasons for this selection? Select all that apply.*



*Overall, how would you rate the level of communication you experienced during remote learning from the District Office and School Building Administration?*




*Overall, how would you rate the level of communication you experienced during remote learning from your child's teacher(s)?*




*During the 2019-2020 school year, did your student utilize district provided busing?*






