- What is a Rollover Budget?
 - A Baseline for budget development
 - Incorporates all Collective Bargaining Salary Agreements
 - Equipment, Supplies and Services include a 3% inflationary increase
 - Makes assumptions based on prior year changes for benefit expenses, i.e. health insurance
 - General Fund Budget <u>doesn't include</u> Stimulus Grants

- 3 Sections of the Rollover Budget include:
 - Payroll
 - Equipment, Supplies & Services
 - Benefits, Debt & Transfers






2022-23 (Prior Year) Revenue Components


Tax Levy History

2023-24 Stimulus Grant Updates

Grants Overview

- Approximately 65% of stimulus funding will be expended by the end of the fiscal year
- Purchases include computers, textbooks, department specific supplies, LETRS training, Sonday System materials and training, software, extended programming like Explorers! and Summer School, and intervention staffing
- Will incorporate grants spending with budget planning

- Where are we in the budget process?
 - Cabinet level discussions in process
 - Holding initial meetings with Principals and Directors
 - They are conducting meetings with Team and Grade level leaders
 - Budget Committee met on January 3, 2023
